





What is CAO?



- Central Applications Office processes all applications for undergraduate courses in Higher Education Institutions (HEI's)
- CAO provides 2 course choice lists (level 8 & levels 6/7 and applicants can make up to 10 course choices on each list
- It is possible to receive an offer from both lists

Requirements

Minimum Entry Requirements:

- Level 8: 2x H5 & 4x O6/H7
- Level 7: 5xO6/H7
- (incl. maths, eng, Irish &/Or 3rd lang.*

*Students must inform colleges of exemptions

Subject Specific Requirements:

- •Primary teaching Mary I: Irish = H4;
- •Sport & Exercise Science UL: Science = O3/H7;
- •Mathematical Science UG: Maths = H5/O1
- *Some Universities & IT's offer a Special Maths exam (student's who missed a maths requirement)

Points Requirement:

- Total points from Students' best six subjects
- (*bonus maths)

***Additional **Requirement:**

- Certain courses are Restricted-Application Courses
- •They have early assessment procedures
- (must apply by 1st Feb)
- E.g. HPAT; Art portfolio; Interview

Restricted Courses & Additional Requirements

Example 1: Medicine UG Level 8 (5 Years)
2 x H5 & 4 x O6/H7
Specific Subject Req: 2 x H4's in two science subjects
(736 points incl. HPAT)

- For medicine after 550 points, LC points are moderated in bands of 5 points e.g. 551-555 becomes 551 points, 556-560 becomes 552 points etc.
- Maximum achieved = 565
- Health Professionals Admissions Test = 300 points
 - ✓ Logical Reasoning & Problem Solving 40%
 - ✓ Interpersonal Understanding 40%
 - ✓ Non-verbal Reasoning 20%
- CAO points + HPAT points = allocated places
- Student must have CAO number to register for HPAT (Test date Feb. 2023)



 - ✓ creativity, presentation and range of work, skills and ability.
- Combination of digital portfolio points & CAO points

Note: 'Restricted Entry Courses' must be entered on CAO application by February 1st.



RESEARCH! Make an Informed Decision

- Don't assume knowledge of a course by its title!
- Don't choose a course/ college based on friend's choices!
- Research the modules within the course content?
- Are there work experience or year abroad options?
- Is this a subject area you enjoy in school?
- Get the college prospectus/ Check college websites
- Go to the Open/taster Days
- Talk to family and friends
- Discuss it with Guidance Counsellor & subject teachers
- Ensure it is the right 'fit'





- Always keep proof of application: print screen receipt
- Form is very straight forward to fill out, tick LC student 2023.
- Students must fill out course lists in:

Genuine Order of Preference

 It is a mistake to put down courses on the basis of their points predictions

Applicants cannot be offered a lower preference course if they have already received an offer of a course higher up on their list

Student A interested in nursing UG places it 5th on list based on 462 points. Student A placed Social Care TUS 3rd on list based on 301 points. Student A receives 544 points in LC & forfeits "dream" course

Are all exams mentioned?


Are all exemptions listed?

Are all the courses shown and in the correct order?

Check for emails from CAO




- Please make sure to regularly check the e-mail account that you used when registering with CAO for new emails from CAO containing important information and instructions.
- You should periodically check your spam, bulk, promotional or junk mail folders, etc. If you find emails from CAO or HEIs are being directed to these folders you should consider adding these email addresses to your contacts or email address book.
- You should also check the Correspondence section of your account which contains a log of all emails sent to you by CAO, and any online queries that you have submitted to CAO whilst logged in to your application.



Offers

 When applicants decline/ defer offers this results in subsequent places becoming available in the next round of offers in order of merit



EXAMPLE

- HEIs issue R1 offers
- The applicants marked in GREEN have enough points to be offered places.
- The applicant marked in RED has enough points for her second preference.

Red applicant got 486 points in their Leaving Cert.

- 1) Their number 1 choice CK101 was 488 points
- 2) Their number 2 choice DN201 was 470 points
- 3) Their number 3 choice AL850 was 477 points

✓ Red applicant got offered their number 2 choice therefore they can not be offered number 3 - 10.

They <u>MAY</u> get offered number 1 in a later round.

Should I apply

HEAR applicants must meet a range of financial, social and cultural indicators (criteria) to be considered for a reduced points place and extra college support. Here is a list of all the HEAR indicators:

- 1. Income: Your family income falls on or below the HEAR Income Limit for the year 2021.
- 2. **Medical/GP Visit Card:** Your family has a Medical Card/GP Visit Card that was in date on 31 December 2022.
- Means Tested Social Welfare: Your family received a means-tested payment from the Department of Social Protection for at least 26 weeks in 2021.
- 4. Socio-economic Group: You belong to a group that is under-represented in higher education based on the occupation and employment status of your parent(s) or guardian(s). The under-represented groups are the Non-Manual Workers Group and the Semi and Unskilled Manual Workers Group.
- 5. **DEIS School Attendance:** You completed five years in a second level school that takes part in the Delivering Equality of Opportunity in Schools (DEIS) scheme run by the Department of Education and Skills.
- 6. **Area Profile:** You live in an area where there is concentrated disadvantage in other words an area where, for example, there is high unemployment and poverty and where only a small proportion of adults have attained third level education.

You must meet Indicator 1, the HEAR Income Limit, plus a correct combination of 2 other indicators to be eligible for HEAR. The combinations are:


What types of disabilities does DARE consider?

- Attention Deficit Disorder (ADD)/Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD)
- · Autistic Spectrum Disorder (including Asperger's Syndrome)
- Blind/Vision Impaired
- · Deaf/Hard of Hearing
- Developmental Co-ordination Disorder (DCD) Dyspraxia
- Dyslexia/ Significant Literacy Difficulties
- Dyscalculia/ Significant Numeracy Difficulties
- Mental Health Condition
- · Neurological Condition (including Brain Injury and Epilepsy)
- Physical Disability
- Significant Ongoing Illness
- Speech and Language Communication Disorder

Prioritisation of Eligible DARE Applicants with a Physical or Sensory Disability

Research has identified that students with physical and sensory (blind/vision impaired or deaf/hard of hearing) disabilities are particularly under-represented in higher education in Ireland relative to all students with disabilities. In order to increase the numbers of DARE students with physical and sensory disabilities being admitted to higher education, the DARE colleges have agreed to prioritise these two groups when allocating reduced points places.

Is DARE for me?

To be eligible for DARE you must meet both the DARE Educational Impact criteria and DARE Evidence of Disability criteria.



Meeting DARE's Educational Impact criteria

Has your disability/condition impacted you in a combination of the following indicators:

- 1. Have you received intervention or supports in post-primary school?
- 2. Has it impacted on your attendance or regularly disrupted your school day?
- 3. Has it affected your school experience and wellbeing?
- 4. Has it impacted on your learning or exam results?
- 5. Has it caused any other educational impact?
- 6. Required for applicants with Dyslexia/ Significant Literacy Difficulties or Dyscalculia/ Significant Numeracy Difficulties: is it severely impacting on your literacy or numeracy scores?

Applicants with Dyslexia/ Significant Literacy Difficulties or Dyscalculia/ Significant Numeracy Difficulties must meet Indicator 6 plus one other indicator.

All other applicants must meet any combination of two indicators from Indicators 1 to 5.

Step 1

- Register your SUSI account online at www.susi.ie
- Complete and submit your application.
- You must apply each year to renew your application.

Step 2

 Based on the information provided in your application, you will receive either a decision letter or a letter requesting documentation so that SUSI can complete its assessment of your application.

Step 3

 Once your supporting documents have been reviewed, you will be advised of the decision on your grant application by post.
 This will be either: A) Awarded or B) Refused

Step 4



Traineeships Traineeships are occupational specific and industry endorsed training programmes providing access to specific occupations in designated sectors. A Traineeship combines learning in an education and training setting and in the workplace.
